- Intergenerational sustainability – balancing economic development with environmental stewardship through Ngā Pou e Whā: Te Āhanga, Te Taiao, Te Oranga, and Te Rarawatanga.
- Transparent and accountable governance – ensuring decisions are made collectively, with clear communication and measurable outcomes.
- Strong external representation – advocating for Te Rarawa interests at regional and national levels, building partnerships that deliver benefits for our whānau.

I am committed to advancing the strategic priorities outlined in our plan, including strengthening identity and participation, building marae capacity, and protecting our taonga tuku iho. My experience in governance roles, iwi development projects and Treaty related work has equipped me to provide strategic leadership, foster collaboration, and represent Te Rarawa with mana.

I would be privileged to serve as Chairman and work alongside our trustees, marae delegates, and whānau to achieve the aspirations of Te Rarawa. Thank you for considering my nomination.
